


## Call for interest: Join the AGROECOLOGY Partnership’s Enlarged Stakeholder Board

### Why should your organisation engage?

Stakeholder engagement is essential to achieve the AGROECOLOGY Partnership’s objectives. The ESB provides a space for collaboration between the AGROECOLOGY Partnership and a wide range of organisations from different sectors, helping to ensure that our activities remain relevant, inclusive, and impactful.

Being part of the ESB is a clear commitment to supporting the agroecology transition in Europe, in line with the Farm to Fork strategy for 2030 and the European Green Deal. The [Strategic Research and Innovation Agenda](#) of the AGROECOLOGY Partnership seeks to contribute to these policy goals through its vision and different objectives:

The AGROECOLOGY Partnership offers a unique opportunity to:

- Contribute and support shaping the agroecology transition;
- Be part of a broad, diverse, multi-sector community committed to the agroecology transition;
- Enlarge your network with all relevant actors committed to the agroecology transition;
- Work as an ambassador to share the vision and objectives of the AGROECOLOGY Partnership to achieve the agroecology transition;
- Get your organisation visible for the agroecology community via our website where all ESB members will be listed.

### What's involved?

The ESB is organised into 7 thematic Colleges, representing a broad range of stakeholders from farm to fork:

- **College of Farmers' Organisations** (e.g.: regional or national representatives, unions, non-profit organisations)
- **College of Agricultural Knowledge and Innovation Systems (AKIS)** (e.g.: public and private advisory services, extension services)
- **College of Economic Activities and Actors of Value Chains** (e.g.: up or downstream value chain actors)
- **College of Civil Society** (e.g.: citizen organisations, NGOs)
- **College of Policy Actors** (e.g.: policy design and/or implementation at regional, national, international levels, etc.)
- **College of Living Labs and Research Infrastructures** (from local, regional, national, European or international levels)
- **College of Sister Initiatives** (e.g.: other HEU Partnerships, HEU Soil Mission, international initiatives)

### How does it work?

- **Membership:** Membership is granted at the organisational level for the duration of the AGROECOLOGY Partnership, with each organisation free to designate one representative. All ESB member organisations and their respective representative will be publicly listed on the AGROECOLOGY Partnership website.
- **Time commitment:** Approximately 1 week per year. This includes two annual online meetings (one in spring and one in autumn), one optional in-person meeting and additional activities, such as dissemination activities (e.g.: sharing news of the AGROECOLOGY Partnership in members' respective networks).
- **Representation in the Science and Stakeholder Advisory Board:** Each of the seven ESB thematic colleges elects a representative (Chair) to be part of the Science and Stakeholder Advisory Board (SciSAB) of the AGROECOLOGY Partnership. This will offer further opportunities to engage in the agroecology transition and the partnership's activities, e.g. provide feedback to the partnership's implementation. College Chairs' travel costs related to SciSAB activities are covered by the AGROECOLOGY Partnership.

### How to join?

All interested organisations are invited to join the ESB by completing this [online application form](#). Members will be selected through a shortlisting process led by the AGROECOLOGY Partnership's Coordination Team at the end of each quarter. It is possible to join the ESB throughout the entire lifetime of the AGROECOLOGY Partnership.
